ADMISSION

Cambridge academic year starts in **September** and ends in **June**. For admission, an Admission Test (of English, Math, Science) is conducted whose *contents* and a *sample paper* can be downloaded from www.pisqdoha.com. After the admission test is passed, the following documents are required to be uploaded (& submitted in hard copy form) to complete the admission process.

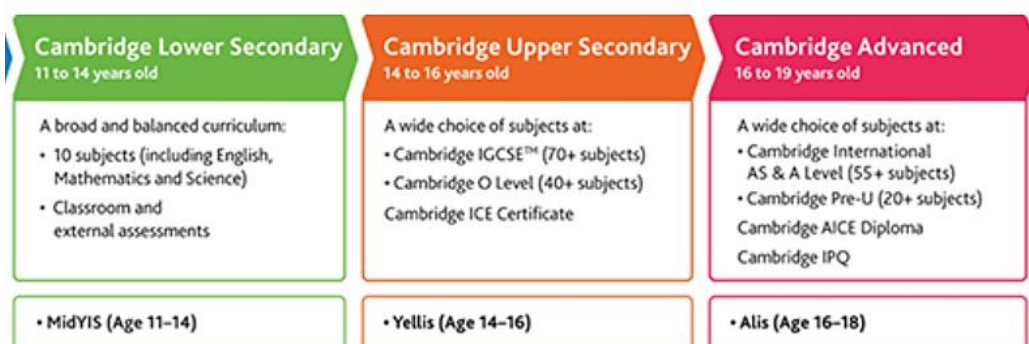

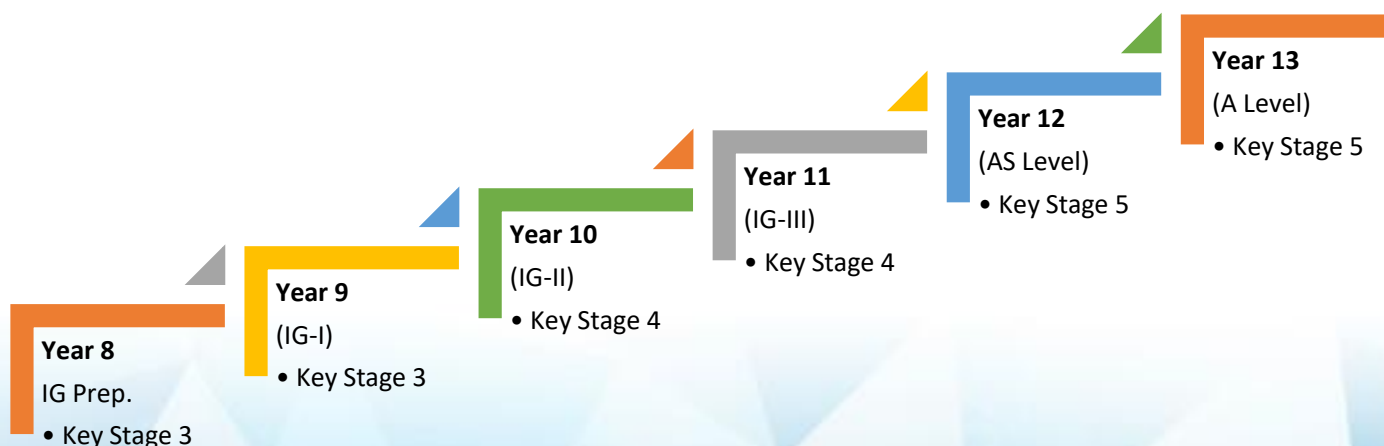
Cambridge Pathway

Cambridge Wing Academic Year and Exam Plan

Key Stage 3 – Year 8 (Preparatory)

This is the level where students begin studying Cambridge International Curriculum for all subjects. They will study **4** compulsory subjects and **3** subjects of their chosen group. The study plan and assessment will follow Cambridge syllabi and paper pattern. [NOTE: *Qatar History* will also be taught through this year as a compulsory subject.]

Year begins:	Last week of August/First week of September
1st Mid-term Exam:	End of October (internally assessed)
1st End-of-term Exam:	December (internally assessed)
2nd Mid-term Exam:	Mid of March (internally assessed)
Final Exam:	May-June (internally assessed)

Key Stage 3 – Year 9 (IG-I)

The students will continue studying Cambridge International curriculum for all subjects (including *Qatar History*). The study plan will follow Cambridge syllabi and paper pattern. Students will be assessed internally at the end of the year. [NOTE: *Qatar History* will also be taught through this year as a compulsory subject.]

Year begins:	Last week of August/First week of September
1st Mid-term Exam:	End of October (internally assessed)
1st End-of-Term Exam:	December (internally assessed)
2nd Mid-term Exam:	Mid of March (internally assessed)
Final Exam:	May-June (internally assessed)

Key Stage 4 – Year 10 (IG-II)

The students of Year 10 will continue studying Cambridge international curriculum for all subjects. The study plan will follow Cambridge syllabi and paper pattern. At the end of the year, students will sit the Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) examination for five subjects: **English (0510)**, **Islamiyat (0493)**, and **Global Perspectives (0457)**, **Urdu (0539)**, **Pakistan Studies (0448)**.

1st Mid-term Exam:	End of October (internally assessed)
1st End-of-Term Exam:	December (internally assessed)
Mock Exam:	Start/Mid of March (internally assessed)
Final Exam:	April-June (externally assessed by CAIE)
Promotion Exam:	May-June (internally assessed)

Key Stage 4 – Year 11 (IG-III)

The students of Year 11 will continue studying Cambridge international curriculum for subjects other than English, Islamiyat, and Global Perspectives. The study plan will follow Cambridge syllabi and paper pattern. At the end of the year, students will sit the Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) examination for four subjects.

Year begins:	Last week of August/First week of September
1st Mid-term Exam:	End of October (internally assessed)
1st End-of-Term Exam:	December (internally assessed)
Mock Exam:	Start/Mid of March (internally assessed)
Final Exam:	May-June (externally assessed by CAIE)

Key Stage 5: A Level - AS (Year-12), A2 (Years-13)

The school has opened the Cambridge A Level tier. There are AS and A2 classes where the school offers six subjects to the students to choose from. Students may opt for AS-only or complete A Level plan of study.

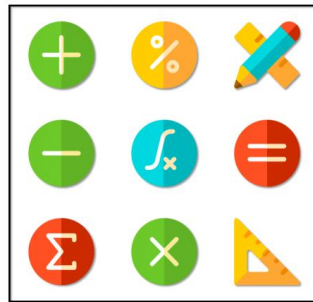
